I spy ...

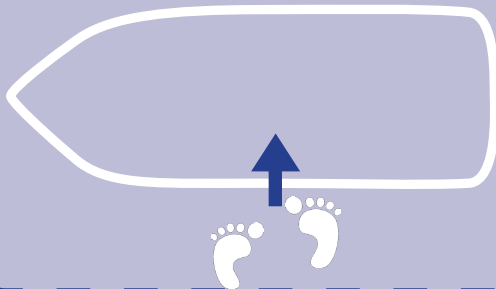
Take a walk around the outside of HMS Victory, what can you see?
